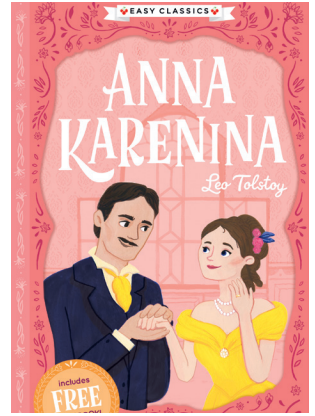

Before Reading

- Look at the cover and title. What do you think this book will be about?
- Discuss:
 - What do you think makes someone truly happy?
 - Have you read or watched other stories about love and difficult choices?
- Introduce themes: love, loyalty, freedom, and identity.

During Reading

- Reflect on key moments:
 - What makes Anna unhappy in her current life?
 - Why is Count Vronsky's attention so important to her?
 - What risks does she face in choosing love over duty?

After Reading

Discussion questions

- Do you think Anna made the right choices?
- What pressures did society place on her?
- How do different characters define love and happiness?

Activities

1. Character Letter

- Write a letter from Anna to her son, explaining her feelings and choices.
- Include her hopes and regrets.
- Optional: Write a reply from the son's point of view.

2. Decision Map

- Create a visual map showing Anna's choices and where they lead.
- Use arrows, symbols, and short notes to show consequences.
- Discuss how one choice can lead to many outcomes.

3. Then and Now

- Compare life for women in Anna's time to life today.
- Make a chart or write a short reflection.
- Think about love, marriage, freedom, and reputation.
