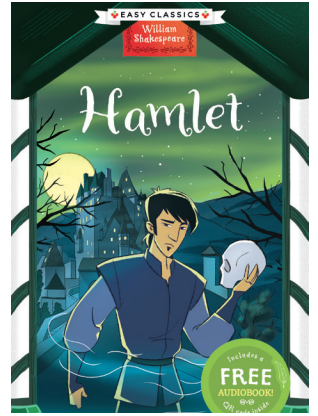

Before Reading

- Look at the title and images. What do you think the story is about?
- Discuss:
 - What would you do if you found out someone hurt your family?
 - What do you know about ghosts and revenge stories?

During Reading

- Pause to reflect on key scenes:
 - Why is Hamlet unsure about what to do?
 - How do other characters react to his behavior?
 - Is Hamlet losing his mind or pretending?

After Reading

Discussion questions

- What do you think drove Hamlet to act as he did?
- Who do you think is the most honest character in the story?
- Was revenge the only answer?

Activities

1. Diary of Doubt

- Write a diary entry from Hamlet's point of view.
- Choose a moment when he's confused or struggling to decide what to do.
- Show his thoughts and feelings.

2. Character Conflict Chart

- Make a chart showing the relationships between characters.
- Include notes on who trusts who — and who doesn't.
- Add arrows to show tension, support, or betrayal.

3. Famous Lines Reimagined

- Take a famous line like "To be, or not to be ..." and rewrite it in modern language.
- Explain what it means in your own words.
- Optionally, turn it into a short scene or monologue.
