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I Look Up

Before Shared Reading

- Show the children the front and back cover of the book.
- Ask: "What do you think this book is about?"
- Read the title of the book.
- Talk with the children about what they expect from the book:
- "Here is a balloon. What else can you see when you look up?"

During Shared Reading

- The adult reads the text aloud to the children.
- Pause occasionally and say:
 "Look at the picture on the right-hand page. What is it?"
- Let the children guess what the text says.
- Then continue reading.

After Shared Reading

- Talk with the children about:
 - "What was the book about?"
- Talk about the theme:
 - "Look up right now. What do you see?"
 - "Have you seen other things than those in the book?" (e.g., at night, on New Year's Eve?)
 - "What is the opposite of looking up?"



Individual Reading

Each child gets a copy of the book.

Instructions:

- "Use a quiet reading voice one that you can hear yourself, but others can barely hear."
- "Use your finger to point to each word as you read."
- Or: "Read with a small pause between each word."

Activities

All children should have a notebook or whiteboard. Each child receives a worksheet and a piece of blue paper.

Task 1

- On the word card sheet, there is a sentence: "I see a sun."
- Cut out the four cards and place them in the correct order.
- Find the sentence in the book.
- Write the sentence.

Task 2

- The sheet also includes word cards with a cloud, a plane, a kite, a bird, a drone, a sun, and a balloon.
- The blue paper is a sky. Glue the seven word cards onto the blue sky.
- Now draw a sun, a cloud, a bird, etc., next to the correct word. Use the book for reference if needed.

Task 3 – Writing Exercise

- At the bottom of the sheet there is a staircase.
- A staircase goes UP! Write "up", "up", "up" on each step.
