It Is Raining!

Before Shared Reading

- Show the children the front and back cover of the book.
- Ask: "What do you think this book is about?"
- Read the title of the book.
- Talk with the children about what they expect from the story.
 "The girl is reading her book while it rains. What else can you do when it's raining?"

During Shared Reading

- The adult reads the text aloud to the children.
- Pause along the way and say:
 "Look at the picture on the right-hand page. What's happening here?"
- Let the children guess what the text says.
- Then continue reading.

After Shared Reading

- Ask the children:
 - "What was the book about?"
- Talk about the theme:
 - "The girl is home alone. And it rains, and rains! She finds lots of things to do. What would you do?"
 - "At the end, she goes outside. What can you do in the rain?"



Individual Reading

Each child gets their own copy of the book.

Instructions:

- "Use a soft reading voice one that you can hear yourself, but others can barely hear."
- "Use your finger to point to each word as you read."

Activities

All children should have a notebook or a whiteboard.

Task 1

- On the worksheet there are three sentences:
- Find the sentences in the book and write the missing words.

Task 2

- What would you most like to do when it rains?
- Find it in the book and write the sentence on the worksheet.

Task 3 – Writing Exercise

- On page 10 it says: "It's raining! I draw a cat."
- Draw the cat at the bottom of the worksheet.
