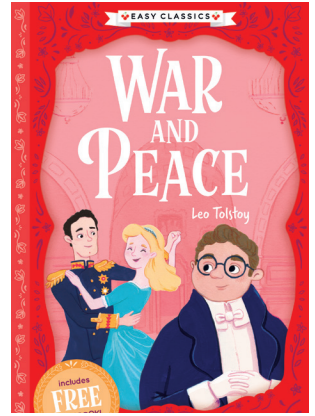
# War and Peace

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## Before Reading

- Look at the title and cover. What do you think this book might be about?
- Discuss:
  - What comes to mind when you think of war?
  - What might 'peace' mean in someone's personal life?
- Introduce themes: identity, love, change, and conflict.

## During Reading

- Pause and reflect on important moments:
  - How are the characters affected by war?
  - What choices do they have to make?
  - What makes their lives difficult or uncertain?

## After Reading

### Discussion questions

- What helped the characters grow or change?
- What types of conflict do they experience?
- What role does peace play in the story?

## **Activities**

### **1. Theme Tracker**

- Choose one theme, such as love, friendship, or change.
- Track how it appears in the story using drawings, quotes, or short notes.
- Share how the theme develops over time.

### **2. Scene Sketch**

- Draw a key moment from the story.
- Include facial expressions and details that show what the characters are feeling.
- Add a short caption or quote from the scene.

### **3. From Conflict to Peace**

- Write a short paragraph or make a comic strip showing how a problem in the story was resolved — or how it could have been.
- Reflect on what peace means to different people in the story.
